Cammeraygal High School Mobile phone and Uniform Policy

Our Wellbeing and fair discipline policy does state that phones cannot be out during school time and if students take them out during the school day they will be confiscated for the reminder of the day. We have found some students

disagreeing about not wanting to give their phones to teachers which does become disruptive and can lead to further negative interactions with their teachers unnecessarily. Anti-racism policy at Cammeraygal High School

Another strong part of the Cammeraygal identity is our strong sense of inclusivity as a school community. This means reminding and educating our students about the importance of these values and the need to respect each other's cultural differences. As part of this education the school will be distributing a survey on what students understand about racism and the impacts it has on others around them. This includes language or behaviour that denigrates any individual in our community because of their racial, cultural or religious background. We also plan to extend this antiracism plan to include our students and several staff members. It is a critical message that needs to form part of the fabric of our community.

Dr Krabman Leaning into Fear presentation

The Zoom webinar which facilitated the Presentation by Dr Peter Krabman on Leaning into fear. Managing teenage anxiety was extremely well received as Dr Krabman emphasised the strategies that were important for students to challenge their anxieties but also develop the coping mechanisms to manage these complexities at school and at home. The presentation was viewed by over 500 parents and went for 2 hours allowing for a Q&A session at the end. Parents/caregivers all commented on how useful it was for a range of reasons. They are now heading into their first assessment period for year 12, with tasks running from week 6 until the end of this term. Each of their assessment tasks in year 12 will contribute directly to their final HSC result, so it is important that students start early and seek support if they are feeling overwhelmed.



Pilates is a body conditioning routine that builds strength, endurance, and coordination without adding muscle bulk. Pilates is performed as controlled movements either through mat exercises or with small equipment to tone and strengthen the body.

Teenagers who practice Pilates regularly feel they have better posture, are less prone to injury and experience better overall health.

Mat exercises are performed on a floor mat using natural body weight as resistance. The Pilates mat program follows a set sequence, with exercises following each other in a natural progression. Beginners start with basic exercises and build up to more advanced positioning and exercises.

Curriculum:

- 1st session Introduction to Pilates Focus on breathing
- 2nd session Pilates Mat work with a resistance band Focus on flexibility

ENVIRONMENT

Stop and Reassess the Western Harbour Tunnel and Beaches Link

Willoughby City Council passed a motion on 31 October calling on the "NSW Government to not enter into any further contracts or tenders associated with the Western Harbour Tunnel and Beaches Link toll road projects prior to the March election in 2023".

Importantly they also moved to "engage and collaborate with impacted councils including North Sydney to identify and address any measures needed to safeguard the community and environment in the Willoughby Local Government Area to prevent further impacts associated with the Western Harbour Tunnel and Beaches Link".

North Sydney Council passed a similar motion in September. The loss of over 1000 mature trees in Cammeray Park and surrounds is a taste of what is in stall for any greenspace next to the Warringah Freeway and tracts of bushland and waterways in other areas of our school catchment, including Flat Rock Gully and Middle Harbour, if these road tollways continue.



No business case has ever been released, no changes made in design despite 1000's of community and school submissions and a Parliamentary Inquiry (including Cammeraygal High School and 20 other schools across the tunnel route). There is no need to rush through this project especially when The Sydney Morning Herald reported that the NSW Government is set to reverse the construction techniques for the Western Harbour Tunnel which will require a new harbourfront site for a massive boring machine (Major U-turn in construction plans for Sydney's Western Harbour Tunnel 4, November 2022).

This will result in significant changes to the project as approved. The length of the tunnels, gradients, route and location of the dive sites for construction will have to change.

The environmental impacts of these changes have not been explained and it seems as though, no matter what, construction contracts are being pushed to be signed before the end of this year and before

the March election.

It is good news that North Sydney and Willoughby Councils are jointly asking for a stop and reassessment and for no contracts to be signed prior to the state election in March. For the health of our kids – there are unfiltered mega stacks to be built only metres from our school. There will be 8 years of construction traffic through local streets and a significant permanent loss of greenspace in an area with one of the lowest ratios of greenspace per head of population all for a road tollway.

North Sydney Council are erecting a range of signs, including the one to the right and are asking their residents to write to their local MP. It would be great if parents and students could write to the NSW Premier and local state MP to ask that tunnel works and contracts to be halted and reassessed. A quick letter or email is taken very seriously by our elected representatives.
