### **Alexia R's Graduation Day Speech**

Congratulations everyone, we have done it! After 6 years and countless hours of notetaking, sleep-deprived days and arguing over the answers to maths questions, we have graduated. We've had a great time and have made lifelong friendships and memories at Cammeraygal. When I was asked to write a speech for this night, I had to think back to all of my memories from the last six years of my time here. There are so many good things that I have done and learned, that I couldn't fit them all into this speech. But the things that stick out to me the most are the opportunities that we were all afforded here and the relationships I have built with friends, peers and teachers. A precept is a general rule to live by something to guide your actions and behaviour. I would like to share five precepts I think we all have adopted over our time here that have greatly influenced the decisions we have made and the way we have carried ourselves at school. I sincerely hope all of you, regardless of your age, will take something from them.

### Precept Number 1: "Beware; for I am fearless, and therefore powerful" - Mary Shelley

Confidence is a key ingredient to life, and to school. Having the capacity to speak in front of people, to talk to anyone new or to stand up for yourself or others is one of the most important skills to develop. Throughout high school, we have all learned that if you are going to do something, do it with conviction. If you are going to present a speech to the class or sit a maths test in two weeks, practice as much as you can, and study as hard as possible. The HSC has taught us that to succeed, you have to give it everything you've got, we have to give ourselves the best chance to succeed. The best thing about high school has been that it has given us all time to develop a strong sense of self and given us insight into what we're passionate about and want to pursue in the future so we can now attack the next phase of our lives with gusto.

## Precept Number 2: "If you don't like something, change it. If you can't change it, change your attitude" - Maya Angelou

In the middle of high school, we were struck down by our first pandemic in 100 years. Although I'm sure no one needs any reminding, society was locked down for an extended period during Years 9 and 10, and we were forced to learn completely online using Zoom, a program that had only just been developed and that no one had ever used before.

We embraced this challenge and took it in our stride, and it has only made us closer as a cohort and deepened the bonds within our friendship groups and classes. We suffered through the awkwardness of breakout rooms, science YouTube videos and online PE classes, which I thought were a bit strange, but we emerged from the situation more resilient, better able to cope with new challenges, and with better technology skills. All of us struggled through that period in some way, but we approached it with positivity and did marvellously to wrestle with an unfamiliar situation and manage it as best we could.

### Precept Number 3: "No man is an island entire of itself" - John Donne

Teamwork is one of the most important skills one can develop. It teaches communication, it teaches empathy, it teaches effective decision-making, it teaches creativity, it teaches critical and lateral thinking, it helps you to build relationships, become more adaptable, and almost forces you to innovate, try new things, and push yourself out of your comfort zone. Most importantly, it teaches us that no one person has all the answers. Every successful person has a strong team around them, filled with people from different backgrounds, with different interests, and with different skill sets. To really drive change, you must be willing to accept feedback, and be humble enough to acknowledge when your idea isn't quite right, and that someone else's plan should be implemented instead. Over high school, we have learned how critical it is to work productively together, especially in those group projects in Geography that no one did until the last day, and how rewarding it is to accomplish something with your friends.

## Precept Number 4, the most important one: "It is nice to be important, but it is more important to be nice." - John Templeton

If high school has taught us one thing, it is that nothing is more important than investing your best efforts into being a good person. Make an effort to be a valuable friend, classmate and colleague. Find good friends and keep them. Make friends all the time. Find people who are better than you, smarter than you, more athletic than you, and talk to them. Learn from them. Some of the most important things we have learned have been through conversations with others, and not necessarily just with friends. Our teachers, along with our future bosses and colleagues, want to see us succeed.

Always say good morning and good afternoon, always wish people a good weekend and always say please and thank you. Say bless you when people sneeze, remember people's names and birthdays and

open the door for them. Because it is the little things that distinguish us from others and that everyone will remember long after high school, even if you don't.

To conclude, I want to say thank you to all of our teachers who have consistently helped us as much as they can over the years, and who have supported us pastorally as well as academically. 
**Grand Final Results:** We were extremely proud to have 2 of our teams go through to the Grand Finals and both teams won their games, which we are so thrilled about.
