#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT CONTINUED

The conference began in the Museum of Australian Democracy where students were welcomed to the conference by The Hon Jason Clare MP. Students were then split into working groups with delegates from other states and territories where they debated a proposed reform to section 96 of the Constitution - the funding power of the Commonwealth to the States. Over the course of two days, students were addresses by leading political, academic and policy experts, including Professor Anne Twomey (University of Sydney), Dr Andrew Banfield (Parliamentary Library, Canberra) and Professor Alan, (Curtin (University). Students debated the reform, made individual and public submissions to the group and ultimately participated in a real-life referendum on the reform. A communique of the student's recommendation and reflections was then presented to Senator Andrew Lachlan, Deputy President of the Senate.

Following the convention, students were invited to drinks at the Governor-General's house where they met His Excellency General the Hon. David Hurley AC and Mrs Hurley. Students were allowed to tour the Governor General's home and were treated to a sing-along of "You are my sunshine" with Mrs Hurley.

Students then attended a dinner at the National Press Club, where they were addressed by the ACT Young Australian of the Year, Caitlin Figueiredo. On the final day students toured the National Museum of Australia and then attended Parliament House where Sophie met her local representative, Kylea Tink. Students then attended Question Time where they were enthralled, entertained (and shocked!) by the debates in the House of Representatives. It was an amazing opportunity for Sophie to attend and hopefully an experience many other Cammeraygal Legal Studies' students will experience in years to come. Congratulations to Sophie and a huge thank you to Ms Gale who attended and organised the event.





#### Year 8 Enrichment project - the Down Under Discovery Exhibition

Year 8 students travelled to the Australian History Museum to explore the 200 Treasures Exhibit and learn about the stories of the 100 people who have shaped Australia's history.

From this visit the students were asked to choose 1 individual who inspired them and to research their story. They were challenged to construct an interactive museum exhibit to educate and enthuse other young people about their chosen figure. On the day, the Year 4 students were eager to engage with all the projects, discovering information about inspirational Australians. #### Cultural Safety Workshops

Ms Hakimi (Head Teacher History & ARCO) and Ms Papikian (History Teacher) delivered an inclusivity workshop to Year 10 students. This workshop is a pro-active wellbeing initiative which seeks to provide students with an understanding of covert and overt forms of discrimination and how this may manifest in the world around them. Students are taught specific strategies that assist them when dealing with bigotry, in a safe and effective manner, and the importance of being an anti-racist citizen is discussed. This workshop is a whole school initiative and has been presented to the Year 12, 11 and 7 cohort. Next term, Year 8 and 9 will be engaging in this valuable learning experience to develop their social and cultural skills. I thank Ms Hakimi and Ms Papikian for this excellent presentation that is vital to the wellbeing of our students.

#### Year 8 Mathematics Riff

This term the Year 8 Mathematics classes have been learning about Pythagoras' Theorem and rightangled triangles. Throughout the topic, some of the classes have been consolidating the theory by learning a parody to Billy Joel's "The Longest Time" called "c's the Longest Side". The students enjoyed the sporadic rehearsals during class, and it as built up to the inaugural CHS Pythagoras sing-off. 8MATE and 8MATY passionately performed an epic rendition of the song to Ms Melky, Mr Barraclough and Mr Trinh, and the students definitely won't forget that c is the longest side! #### Year 7 Geography excursion to Long Reef

Students utilised secondary sources such as a topographic map and aerial photographs at different historical periods to examine the changing nature of the coastline. They also conducted primary research by investigating the role of the wind, waves, geology and dune vegetation in weathering and erosion of the coastal landscape. We were exceptionally lucky with the weather - while it was very windy, the rain held off until we were on the buses going back to school.



#### **Cammeraygal Merit Award System**

The philosophy behind our merit system is the strong belief that positive behaviour reinforcement is a very powerful tool to reinforce or modify human behaviour. In addition to recognising and reinforcing positive behaviour, we aim to build students' self-esteem through recognising their achievements in a tangible way. The merit system encourages students to work towards achieving personal and academic goals through accumulating different certificates corresponding to the consistency and nature of their efforts.

Student achievement, effort, behaviour that reflects the core values of the school will be recognised through the use of Merit Awards which will be issued using the online database. These awards will be issued by classroom teachers and also by teachers who are responsible for the organization of extracurricular activities, sport and community service.



Some examples of the type of achievements which might lead to a student being given a Merit Award include:

Being a responsible and considerate person; honesty; trustworthiness; achievement to the best of your ability; consistently improved attitude to classwork or homework; care of your environment; sporting endeavours; scholastic excellence; school service; community service; fairness in sport; organisation of school events; politeness to others; helping beyond what is normally asked; respecting the rights of others in a very responsible way; giving extra assistance at sporting events; actively caring to make our school a good place to be; helping others in need; being polite and helpful to visitors and in the community; assisting others to achieve their personal best.

- At the start of the holidays make a list of activities to look forward to. This can include low key activities like gardening, shopping, listening to music and more structured/planned activities like an outing with friends or going on a holiday.
- **Pre-Purchase some healthy and fun snacks that your child can prepare themselves,** making them less dependent on you. This helps avoid the constant requests for food and involves your child in making healthy choices for themselves.

#### **Da Vinci Decathlon**

On April 3rd, eight students from Year 9 attended the Da Vinci Decathlon Sydney Regionals, held at Knox Grammar School. It was a super early start to the day, with registration at 7:30am, so we were all awake at the crack of dawn and ready to roll.

Every year, the Da Vinci Decathlon is hosted by Knox and is a competition consisting of ten subjects, designed to determine which schools will proceed to compete at the state, national and international levels. Each decathlon hosted aligns with a theme for that year; our theme this time around was *Technology and Innovation*.

The day was split into two sessions: in the first, we were given tasks associated with English, Code Breaking, Ideation, and Science. Included in all four subject areas was a combination of many short answer questions, analysis of literature, the pitch of a new creation, interpretation of difficult codes, and three extended responses. The goal was to ultimately finish all questions to the best quality possible, within an 85-minute period, and to get the answers correct.

During this time, groups were called upon to work on their Creative Producer piece, a drama performance that depicted what life would be like without the role of technology in theatre. We were given 8 minutes to prepare a short, minute-long skit, and presented it to the judges who then marked our performance.

The first section was followed by a quick round of trivia, after which we proceeded to the second session. This was made up of Art & Poetry, Engineering, Cartography, and Mathematics. Unlike the first session, however, the time frame for each activity differed: Art & Poetry was due after 50 minutes, Engineering after 60 minutes, and Cartography and Mathematics after 90 minutes. At first, we prioritised the tasks that were due to be submitted first, then when it seemed that this was not efficient enough, we decided to *divide and conquer*.



Overall, the day was a memorable experience that allowed us to nurture many skills that we hadn't tapped into much prior to the decathlon, and although we were unfortunately unable to snag a medal or trophy, it was definitely an event worth experiencing.

Special thanks to Mr Deasey, who organised and registered our team for the decathlon, and Mrs Thompson, who accompanied us to Knox and dealt with our antics for the day.

#### **NSW Law Society Mock Trial Competition**

On Thursday, 4 April, Cammeraygal HS competed in the NSW Law Society Mock Trial Competition for the first time. The Mock Trial Competition is open to schools across NSW for students in years 10 and 11. The program aims to introduce students to the NSW judicial system by providing practical experience into the running of a court case in a true-to-life adversarial setting. Students learn advocacy, debating and problem-solving skills.

The Cammeraygal team consisted of Amy B, Ofelia C, Kate H, Leo G, Caitlyn R, Eric C and Amelie W. The students represented the Plaintiff in a negligence claim for a horse-riding accident. Students took on a range of roles - barristers, solicitors, witnesses, and a magistrate's clerk. The mock trial pitted our students against students from Riverside Girls with the matter being adjudicated by a real-life magistrate! The students performed very impressively to secure a win against Riverside Girls - an amazing accomplishment for their first ever mock trial! Round two will be held next term.


